#### GCA BOARD MEETING FEBRUARY RECAP

Meeting Recap Our new GCA website is well underway. All Board members and potential board candidates, please provide your head-shot for GCA website and a short bio to Samantha and Sandi. The City of Detroit will provide American Rescue Signs to match our Grandmont neighborhood signs. Discussion took place regarding Grandmont's 100th Anniversary in 2023 and the upcoming 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Association in 2027. Our GCA memberships are up, adding another 67 paid members and continuously growing. To further increase membership, a membership drive is planned beginning February 5th. Additional membership drive ideas were suggested such as building a form inside of PayPal, referral program, raffles, incentives, door-to-door, etc. Environmental provided responses to questions from last month regarding operating

commercial businesses in a residential community. Advised Forestry and Greening of Detroit has trees to plant, and Environmental will check on how Grandmont can get involved. Planning of the 2024 Annual Community Business meeting and Youth & Education Expo is underway and volunteers from the community are needed to make it successful. Public comment covered a variety of topics - attending the Schoolcraft Improvement Association (SIA) meeting in opposition of the Greenfield Supply Co (Green Valley Properties) on expansion of their Concrete Crusher operations located at Greenfield & I-96 to various programs currently hosted at the Redford library.

#### RADIO PATROL/SAFETY AND SECURITY

#### **HELLO GOOD NEIGHBORS!**

Our patrol was organized over 50 years ago after the 1967 uprising. It is supported by local, county and state law enforcement. We were the fourth patrol to become active in Detroit, hence GRANDMONT PATROL #4. Originally, the patrol used CB radios to communicate, but we currently use official police radios supplied by the Detroit Police Department.

Grandmont #4 Radio Patrol is recruiting and we need your help. Grandmont has 42 blocks to patrol and we only need 1-2 hours a week for you to patrol your community.

As a patrol member, volunteers are trained to look for specific signs while on patrol. They report any suspicious activity to the police and NEVER put themselves in danger or confront suspicious individuals.

#### STREET/BLOCK CAPTAINS CORNER

Thank you good neighbors for answering the call to become block captains. This month we welcome Kavivi Muli, who will be a new captain on Archdale, although she resides on Grandmont. She is another example of a good neighbor that wants to help keep our community safe and vibrant. A special thanks to Mrs. Cora Duncan-Foster for tapping her shoulder for this assignment.

As a reminder, your captains are your direct connection to GCA. If you have any questions/concerns we are here to help. In the last issue of the Grandmonitor, an updated roster was listed for your reference.

We look forward to meeting our good neighbors at our Annual meeting on April 13th, where we will host a table where you're able to connect and engage your captains as well as receive updates on upcoming events.

#### VACANT PROPERTY TASKFORCE/ENVIRONMENTAL

#### VACANT PROPERTY TASK FORCE / ENVIRONMENTAL

**PROPERTY TAXES**. If you are buying or selling your home, it's important to check with the <u>Assessor's Office</u> (Director, Mr. Alvin Horhn, office: <u>313-224-3040</u>) to make certain you understand how your taxes are, or will be calculated. The current owner's taxes will most likely not be your taxes in the following year. This could be an unwelcome surprise if you aren't prepared. Don't rely on the realtor's information.

<u>GOOD NEWS.</u> Work is progressing at the <u>Archdale Lot</u> adjacent to the Community Garden. We are using beautification funds from Huntington Bank to add a border fence and extend a chain link fence to secure the western border of the lot.

#### DLBA (DETROIT LAND BANK AUTHORITY)

VPTF continues to remain in contact with the Land Bank regarding seven houses of concern in Grandmont for Nuisance Abatement (3 on Asbury Park, 3 on Archdale, 2 on Rutland). Three newly vacant houses were reported and we are checking ownership and codes.

#### ILLEGAL LAWN PARKING

If you've signed up for text notices for our Garbage and Bulk/Recycling pick-up dates (<u>text your address to 313-800-7905</u>), you have probably received "reminders" not to park your vehicle on the lawn which is not allowed for many reasons including common sense & stupidity. The city is also coordinating efforts to remove long-time non-running cars parked on the lawns in backyards. Warnings and reasonable time will be given to the owners to remove these vehicles (why not make a couple of \$\$\$ and call a company to remove it yourself), but as this is a quality of life as well as a health concern, stricter tactics including city towing is being implemented.

If you know of a car(s) parked on lawns please notify environmental, Steele Hughes (Department of Neighborhoods (313-236-3473), or your Neighborhood Police Officer (NPO) Shawn Childrey (313-590-5199) with the address and additional information

<u>ALLEY</u> (<u>Between Lyndon & Ray Monnier</u>). This alley needs to be paved or graded for <u>ease of traffic getting to the garages behind</u> some Southfield houses. The city did clean the alley, but areas are still overgrown. Owners are responsible for some of these areas. Grandmont is trying to get some help from the city after this was brought to our attention from a concerned neighbor.

#### SENIOR CITIZEN SOLID WASTE DISCOUNT INFORMATION

#### Don't forget to apply in July for this discount if you are 65 years or older!

The application period is July 1 through September 15. The City of Detroit may provide a discount to homeowners who are at least 65 years old and have a Principle Residence Exemption (PRE) on file. The Solid Waste Fee is \$240.00. Qualifying Seniors will receive a discount of \$120.00. If you continue to own and occupy the home, you will not need to reapply each year.

#### WHERE DO I APPLY?

File a Senior Citizen Application for Solid Waste Discount with the City of Detroit Treasurer's Office. You must file your request for discount between July 1st and September 15th.
